
Current Gallery Exhibit All Creatures Great and Small, Animals in Art

Faye Wrubel was painting conservator at the Art Institute of Chicago for 36 years, retiring in 2016, and is a Fellow of both the American Institute for Conservation and the International Institute for Conservation, and a Fulbright Fellow in 2000 teaching conservation in Buenos Aires Argentina. She has received many other awards, publications and grants. In her tenure at the Art Institute, she conserved several hundred masterpiece paintings from the Medieval period to the present, including works by artists such as Caillebotte, Gauguin, Manet, Matisse, and Van Gogh, just to name a few.

Looking at Paintings from the Inside Out will be a presentation of a variety of treatments representing different techniques and paintings from many historical time periods. Featured will be the conservation treatment of the masterpiece painting *Paris Street; Rainy Day* by Caillebotte.


There is no charge for this program, although donations will be welcome.

There is never a cover charge for the Songwriters Showcase.



Workshop


Energize Your Art August 26 and 27 - 10 am to 5 pm each day Register by August 12th on our website or by calling the Center (see below).
