


## Carl Johnson--Galena Watercolorist Opening August 18

# Songwriters Showcase features Dave Hummel on July 20 at 7 pm

Dave Hummel, songwriter and guitarist in the Mississippi String Band, has been playing the tri-state area and regionally for over 40 years, and was one of the original members of the country/blues/rock Mississippi Band.



After winning the Sundown Country Music Festival in the 70's, the band went on the road from 1977 to 1983 playing concerts with Hank Williams Jr., Ernest Tubb, Nitty Gritty Dirt Band, Sha Na Na, and Dr. Hook and the Medicine Show. The band was hired in 1981 to appear in the movie *Take This Job and Shove It*.

The original Mississippi Band was inducted into the lowa Rock 'n' Roll Hall of Fame in 2010. The first Mississippi Band album, *Take Your Chances*, was released in 1981. The CD "Dave's Songs" features the band and Dave's wife Billie Sue Hummel on all original songs.

There is never a cover charge for the Songwriters Showcase.

Faye Wrubel to present
"Looking at Paintings from the Inside Out"
Sunday July 30 at 2 pm

Ever wondered how historic masterpieces can still survive after hundreds of years, and still be beautiful? Come to the Center to hear a free presentation by Faye Wrubel, who will tell about the world of Art conservation and restoration.

Faye Wrubel was painting conservator at the Art Institute of Chicago for 36 years, retiring in 2016, and is a Fellow of both the American Institute for Conservation and the International Institute for Conservation, and a Fulbright Fellow in 2000 teaching conservation in Buenos Aires Argentina. She has received many other awards, publications and grants. In her tenure at the Art Institute, she conserved several hundred masterpiece paintings from the Medieval period to the present, including works by artists such as Caillebotte, Gauguin, Manet, Matisse, and Van Gogh, just to name a few.

"Looking at Paintings from the Inside Out" will be a presentation of a variety of treatments representing different techniques and paintings from many historical time periods. Featured will be the conservation treatment of the masterpiece painting *Paris Street;* Rainy Day by Caillebotte.




He will give one-on-one attention to each student as they create a still life on the first afternoon, after a demonstration in the morning, and an interpretation of a photo of their own choosing the second day.

And so goes a meeting of a core group of volunteers known as the Openers and Closers. Crowded into the Art Center's little conference room, they meet to plan their schedules, talk over any problems, and brainstorm ideas for future exhibits. The group-made up of (from top left) Karen Wilson, Elizabeth Boggess, Stephanie O'Shaughnessy, Patricia Lehnhardt. bottom left: Janet Zehr, Denise Tollensdorf, Carole Sullivan, and Sheila Haman--take on the responsibility of making sure the Center is opened and closed on time, along with all the many tasks that entails.

On an average day, an Opener arrives at the Center for the Arts, before it opens to the public, to unlock the door, turn on the lights, adjust the heating or air conditioning, turn on the computers and videos, and generally check that everything is ready for the volunteer who will be staffing the desk and for visitors. When it's time to close, a Closer reviews the list of visitors and activities during the day, counts and records the money, turns off the equipment and lights, and finally locks up for the night. But these are only the most visible of their duties.

The Openers and Closers also take on a plethora of other tasks that keep the Arts Center functioning well. They train new volunteers, fill out a daily accounting sheet, take messages, fill in for absent volunteers, help to prepare and clear up after various functions, water the flowers in the summer and shovel the snow in the winter. They can be counted on to see what needs to be done and to be responsible for taking care of it.

All these responsible, dedicated volunteers deserve our admiration and our thanks!


