Dear Dennis,

We are excited to announce that on June 7, The Galena Center for the Arts will celebrate our fifth birthday! The time has gone quickly, and it's hard to realize that we have been celebrating regional arts and artists for five years. We have great plans for the next five years, and the years after that too!

We have some statistics to report:

- In our last fiscal year, our general membership increased by 56% and our Corporate membership increased by 85%.
- We have shown the work of over 130 Exhibiting artists.
- Since 2013, we have welcomed over 15,000 guests to the Center, to experience our exhibits, openings, workshops, special events, and to be entertained at radio shows, Sunday Salons and Songwriters Showcases. We plan to continue to do all this, and more.

Our goals remain to support regional art and artists and to advocate for the benefits of the arts in education as well as to our economy. As soon as Midwest Medical Center's refinancing is completed, we hope to buy the building at 219 Summit Street, where we have been located since 2014. So much has been accomplished, and there's so much more to do!

Thanks so much to those of you who have supported us along the way, and those of you who have more recently discovered the Center and are now supporters and volunteers.

Come help us celebrate the beginning of our sixth year and the opening reception for the art exhibit Friday June 8, 5–7 pm


Fiber Art is a rather recent term, appearing after WWII, when curators recognized the aesthetic of otherwise utilitarian objects. In the 1950s artists began using fibers to make non-functional pieces of work and in the 60s and 70s an international revolution in fiber art emerged. Fibers can be from plants or animals, made into contemporary or traditional designs. Come to the gallery to see what fun pieces our regional artists have created. Emily Cotton Cram, Our featured chalk artist



Emily, who is from Dubuque, creates whimsical illustrations centered around native flora, fauna and farm life. She also creates storybook illustrations centered around heroines and mythology, as well as illustrating children's books for local authors. She uses watercolor and pen, but also uses acrylic and gouache paint or whatever catches her fancy. Emily attended **Clarke University for several years** before becoming a freelance artist. She has been experimenting with chalk art for many years, from making art for kids on playgrounds to competing in local "chalk the walks". She presently has artworks exhibited in the "Portals and Visions" exhibit at the Smokestack in Dubuque, IA., which will run through July 31.

Fête de la Musique June 21, 10 am - 4 pm

For the last 35 years in France, the 21st of June is not just the longest day of the year but also the day of the *Fête de la Musique*. This "festival of music" is no ordinary festival. Created in France in 1982, it has been taken up by neighboring countries where it has been equally successful, and is now celebrated in over 120 countries. Music takes over city streets, with live bands, singers, amateur musicians, drummers, and dancers. expressing themselves through music and inviting the crowd to enjoy themselves. So this year on the solstice, we will initiate Fête de la Musique, also known as Make Music Day, in Galena.



From 10 am to 4 pm in Washington Park, Lenny Wayne and other musicians, sponsored by the Downtown Business Association, will be encouraging everyone, especially kids, to join in the music. In the evening from 7-9 pm, there will be a free celebration of music at the Center for the Arts. Bring your voice, your acoustic instruments and your dancing shoes! We invite everyone, of every age and every taste in music, to join in the fun.

We mourn the loss of Richard Pearce






For the past 16 years Richard Pearce spent much of his spare time trekking through woods, prairies, and along waterways throughout Illinois, Iowa, and Wisconsin obtaining high resolution images of plants and, more recently, getting close up, slow-motion video of the insects that visit them. He finished a total of 358 wildflower species, most of which are available on his website at <u>arrasimages.com</u>. His videos may be seen on YouTube, for example <u>Stories of our Wildflowers</u>. He was a brilliant, creative and kind man.

Richard will be greatly missed. A celebration of his life will be held at the Galena Center for the Arts on June 14 at 6 PM.



Figure Drawing Thursdays 1:30–3:30 pm



This ongoing class integrates mindfulness with yoga and breath-work.


