




# **Embroidery Circle Wednesday from 1-3 pm**





### **Volunteer of the Month - Sandy Winge**



If you live in Galena or have spent much time here, you probably know or at least recognize Sandy Winge.

For many years, you might have seen her in the popular Galena River Wine and Cheese on

Galena's Main Street, which she and husband Ken owned and operated.



A very talented actor, she could also have been seen in performances of Main Street Players, which she joined in 1989 and acted with until they disbanded. She played one of the historical figures in the 2015 Civil War Sesquicentennial "Peace in Union" performance and has portrayed Galena residents in the annual Cemetery Walk. Most recently, in 2016 she reprised her role as Mary Lowes, a German settler who told the story of her hard life in early Galena's "cabbage town."

At the Galena Center for the Arts, you might see Sandy at the welcome desk greeting visitors and, if you're lucky, watch her writing book plates for the Center's library in her beautiful calligraphy. In the 1970's, she took a few classes and got hooked. She says, "I've always loved writing, in terms of style." Calligraphy is an exacting art form, which fits her personality, she believes, "I'm more disciplined than creative, and I've always been patient." While one would agree about the patience involved, Sandy is really quite creative, with an inate sense of design apparent in everything she does.

Sandy's calligraphy, like her acting, is generously donated to Galena's organizations. Along with her work for the Center, she recently created all the table signage for the Festival of the Arts'

Shakespearean performance this year. When complimented on her work, she simply says, "It's a fun thing to do."
