Please join us to welcome Dubuque-based soprano Megan Gloss back to our stage. Her recital will include repertoire from the operatic canon, as well as jazz, contemporary musical theater and a new selection, "Sure on this Shining Night," penned for Gloss by native Dubuque composer Adam O'Dell.

Accompanied by Jill Klinebriel on piano, Gloss will be joined by mezzosoprano Mandy Diercks, of Kieler, Wis., on two duets: The popular "Flower Duet," from Delibes' opera "Lakme" and "Mira, o Norma," from Bellini's "Norma." Other musical highlights will include "Casta Diva," from "Norma"; "O Mio Babbino Caro," from Gianni Schicchi"; "Summertime," from "Porgy and Bess"; "Stars and the Moon," from "Songs for a New World"; "Back to Before," from "Ragtime"; and more!

About Megan:

An Iowa winner and Midwest finalist in the National Association of Teachers Singer Artist Awards, as well as an Anna Sosenko Assist Trust grant recipient, soprano Megan Gloss' musical endeavors have taken her from Dubuque's Grand Opera House to concert halls throughout the Midwest, the sunflower fields of Tuscany, historic European cathedrals illuminated by candlelight and the rain forests of Puerto Rico.


Local audiences might recognize her as Amalia Balash in *She Loves Me*, Nettie Fowler in *Carousel*, Aldonza in *Man of La Mancha*, Mabel in *The Pirates of Penzance*, Queen of the Night in *The Magic Flute* and appearances with the Dubuque Symphony Orchestra. A vocalist with Madison Opera, she made her European debut in 2011.

When not singing, Megan is the Features Editor for the Telegraph Herald, where she also edits Her Magazine, and contributes to international magazines. She lives with her husband Keith and their cat Mabel in Dubuque.




In the Park with John Martinson August 17, 10 am–3 pm 620 S. West Street, Galena

The Center for the Arts is planning an exciting new addition to its offerings: a community chorus, to be called the Summit Street Singers.

Adults and students of all abilities (including beginners) are invited to join the Summit Street Singers, a community chorus that will meet every two weeks. No audition required.

The Summit Street Singers choral group offers local singers an opportunity to make new friends and renew old friendships through music. The community chorus will work on four-part music of varying styles from classic to pop.



Kent Parry will serve as the director of the choir. He received his bachelor degree in Music Education from Western Illinois University, his Masters degree of Music Education from Northern Illinois University, and has 36 years of experience as a high school choral director. Susan Lipnick will accompany the choir on piano. Rehearsals will be in the performance space at the Center, and may be entered through the doors near the lower parking lot.





Table Reading September 10 Dr. Bibfeldt encounters God



on Kent Parry



The Center for the Arts is planning an exciting new addition to its offerings: a community chorus, to be called the Summit Street Singers. "Years ago, there was a very active community chorus in Galena, and I think many have missed having that," says Carole Sullivan. "I think the time is right to start one again." It is our good fortune that veteran choirmaster Kent Parry now lives in Galena and is enthusiastic about organizing and conducting the chorus.

Kent got his start in music very young. At the age of four, he was already singing with his brother for a group of the Rebekahs, an order of the Odd Fellows, where his mother played the piano. He also fondly remembers singing with his dad in the church choir. Throughout elementary and high school, he continued performing. In his junior year, he sang the lead role of Thomas Jefferson in 1776. In college, he belonged to the Newcomers,

a song and dance group that performed at the university as a warm-up act for Bob Hope, Red Skelton, and Burl Ives. He also sang in a madrigal group and the University singers, and served as President of the Student Chapter of Music Educators National Congress.

Kent received his bachelor's dearee from Western Illinois University and his M.A. in **Music Education from** Northern Illinois University. For thirty-six years, he taught and directed choirs in high schools in Iowa and Illinois. He spent twentyeight of those years at **Carmel Catholic High School**, a BVM-Carmelite school in Mundelein, Illinois. During his tenure there, he taught music classes, including quitar, was department



chairman for six years, and directed many different choirs. At one point, along with his other responsibilities, he was directing nine different choirs and singing groups!

Kent's vision for the Summit Street Singers is that it will be inclusive everyone is welcome—and that it must be fun. "Everyone should walk away with a smile on their face!" he says. "We will spend time making new friends and renewing old friendships through music." He plans for the whole group to perform four-part music of varying styles, from classics to pop; Susan Lipnick will be the accompanist. Kent would also like to develop small, a cappella groups of singers.

The first meeting of the chorus will be in August. Everyone is invited and welcome – no audition necessary. Please come and join in the fun!




Gallery Volunteers
