Catch the Train in Galena with trains running November 29 - December 15

All Aboard!!! The Galena Center for the Arts will offer a family holiday celebration of model trains, "Catch the Train in Galena," from 1-4 PM Thursdays through Sundays from Nov 29 through Dec. 15. This event will be a great opportunity for the elder generation to introduce the younger generation to a variety of model trains.







Railway enthusiast Philip Jackman will display his N Scale operating trains for three weekends of running trains. The large display features a variety of topography, including small towns, cities, deserts, canyons, oceans and more, with up to three trains running at a time. This year it will include a new module featuring the corner at East Dubuque, as well as modules from other train enthusiasts in the region, including eight feet of the Wisconsin Highlands in fall colors, a working lift bridge and a four seasons module which shows the same scene in all four seasons of the year.





Volunteers of the MonthPaul and Nancy McMenamin

When Paul McMenamin's sister, who is in the nursing home connected to the Center for the Arts, couldn't attend performances because the elevator was out of order, Paul and Nancy donated funds toward its repair. When the Center called for helpers on the Fix-up, Clean-up days, they came and worked. When bartenders were needed for various events, they took the training and now serve drinks on the Songwriters evenings and for other occasions. When help was needed for Chalkfest, they both were there helping. And when chairs need to be moved or something needs to be fixed, Paul quietly does it.

Both Paul and Nancy are modest about all the things they do for the Center for the Arts and for several service organizations. "We just like to help," Nancy says. "We don't do anything special." Most people would differ with that last comment. Their first

commitment after moving to the area full-time in 2011 was to JDFC, which they saw as "a good opportunity to give back." JDFC was where they met Carole Sullivan and learned about the Center for the Arts.

Besides all they do for the Center, both of them are part of the Medical Reserve Corps, directing people and doing paperwork



during emergencies. They also volunteer for Community Organizations Active in A Disaster (COAD.) As a retired electrician and having just received his ham radio license, Paul is active in coordinating communications for Emergency Management.


Along with all their volunteer work, they have also become a part of Galena's music community. Nancy has been a singer all her life and began taking guitar lessons a couple years ago. 
Gallery Volunteers
