





Barbara Heitzman, a celebrated, award-winning artist and founder of Plein Air Painters of Dubuque, is a retired teacher of Expressive Arts and Creative Drama.

This show includes a variety of painting genres such as still life, landscape, and people in specific settings. She also uses a variety of media consisting of acrylic, watercolor, and hard and soft pastel. The work was created both in the studio and plein air. Barbara has been working recently in cold wax and oil, which will also be included in the exhibit.

Volunteer of the Month Jean Dregne

Jean Dregne, Board member of the Center for the Arts, has had two lifelong passions. Even as a young child, she knew she wanted to be a teacher, and she loved music. Her devotion to music and to education have given her joy and stayed with her throughout her life. "Without art and music," she muses, "there is no life."

Jean began playing the piano at age five. As a young adult, she also took voice lessons. Pursuing her dream, in college she majored in both vocal music and education. One of her fondest memories from her student days is of going to the rehearsals of Chicago's Lyric Opera—and getting to sit in the front row. She even sang in the chorus of two operas, including La Traviata.



Becoming a music teacher was a natural path for Jean, one she has loved. Throughout her career, she taught vocal music at the middle school level. She enjoys all kinds of music and would use whatever the kids liked to "hook" them. Rap, she says, is a wonderful way to teach rhythm patterns. One of her goals was for her kids to learn to read music, so she introduced it to them so gradually they hardly realized they weren't just having fun.

Jean retired in 2002 and moved to Galena in 2008, where she has continued to be active. She has done some substitute teaching, and serves on the Board of Prairie Ridge. As choir director at the First Presbyterian Church for about five years, she enjoys leading the small but dedicated group of singers. As a Board member of the Center for the Arts, she is excited about all the Center offers the community, visitors, and the all artists who work and display their talents here.

Asked about her role on the Board, she says, "As an avid lover of music and arts, I am thrilled to come here and contribute." She is excited about the idea of having a real theater for musical and theatrical performance. As an educator, it is not surprising that she would especially like to see more children and young people come to the Center. "The arts help them grow," she declares confidently, having personally fostered and witnessed that effect in her many years of teaching.

- Winning artist will receive a \$250 prize, as well as an unveiling reception and social media marketing.
- The contest deadline is May 31st, 2020. All artwork should be dropped off at the Galena Center for the Arts.
- A winner will be chosen in mid June.
